

IPF AT THE “NUIT DE LA SCIENCE” IN GENEVA



Saturday and Sunday 10th and 11th of July 2010, IPF-Switzerland participated in the eighth edition of "[La Nuit de la Science](#)" in Geneva, a very popular event organised every two years by the "Musée d'histoire des sciences".

Located in a beautiful garden, near the lake, "La Nuit de la Science" aims to create a link between science, the scientists and the public. The theme of this year edition was "Extreme and Limits".
